Welcome to Primary Stages and our production of *Ibsen's Ghost: An Irresponsible Biographical Fantas*y by Charles Busch and directed by Carl Andress!

For decades, Charles' unique blend of wit, theatricality, and camp has been delighting audiences with downtown cult classics like Vampire Lesbians of Sodom and
 Psycho Beach Party, his Broadway hit The Tale Of The Allergist's Wife, and of course, The Confession of Lily Dare and The Tribute Artist here at Primary Stages.
 Now, after years of lovingly skewering Hollywood classics, Charles now trains his satiric crosshairs on one of theater's most revered figures – Henrik Ibsen.

With timeless works like A Doll's House, Hedda Gabler, and An Enemy of the People, Ibsen made a name for himself as the "father of realism," inspiring the likes of George Bernard Shaw, Anton Chekhov, and Eugene O'Neill. He was known for his provocative social commentaries with complex heroines, and somber psychological brooding.

In this "Ibsen play that Ibsen never wrote," instead of being dragged into Ibsen's dark emotional turmoil, Charles archly parodies these aristocratic dramas. With a refracted lens, he invites us to laugh at their frivolity and delight in spectacle. A master of camp, Charles has the ability to unveil the serious as silly and the silly as serious. This in turn allows us to open our imagination, poking fun at ourselves, and the society and conventions we take as customary.

This is why we go to the theater, to have someone show the world around us in a new light...and have fun doing it! We are so grateful to artists like Charles who are so unapologetically themselves and can share their world with us with such generosity. And we are so grateful to audiences like you, who are eager to dive right into the fun!



Charles Busch is an actor, playwright, and drag legend. He is the author and star of many plays, including *Vampire Lesbians of Sodom*, one of the longest running plays in Off Broadway history. His play *The Tale of the Allergist's Wife* played 777 performances on Broadway and received a Tony nomination for Best Play. He wrote and starred in the film versions of his plays *Psycho Beach Party* and *Die, Mommie, Die!*, the latter of which won him the Best Performance Award at

the Sundance Film Festival. He has been honored with a special Drama Desk Award for career achievement as both performer and playwright, and received the Flora Roberts Award for Sustained Achievement in the Theater by the Dramatists Guild. As a cabaret entertainer, he is a two-time Manhattan Cabaret Award winner, a Bistro Award honoree, and has appeared in many cities including San Francisco, Los Angeles, London, Paris, and New York's Jazz at Lincoln Center's American Songbook series. His autobiography, *Leading Lady: The Memoir of a Most Unusual Boy*, is published by BenBella books.

Primary Stages is an Off Broadway not-for-profit theater company dedicated to inspiring, supporting, producing, and sharing the art of playwriting. We operate on the strongly held belief that the future of American theater relies on nurturing playwrights and giving them the artistic support needed to create new work. Since our founding in 1984, we have produced more than 135 new plays.

Our productions and artists have received critical acclaim, including numerous Tony, Obie, Lortel, Off Broadway Alliance, AUDELCO, Outer Critics' Circle, Drama League, and Drama Desk awards and nominations. Primary Stages supports playwrights and develops new works through commissions, workshops, readings, and our education and engagement programs: the Dorothy Strelsin New American Writers Group, Marvin and Anne Einhorn School of Performing Arts (ESPA), Creative Access Grants, the Echoes Writers Group, our Free Student Matinee Program, and the Primary Stages Off Broadway Oral History Project.
